


Old Hundredth

Many of the British Protestants who left England during the reign of Mary Queen of Scots - went to Geneva. That city already had a strong tradition of metrical psalms, frequently sung to the music of Louis Bourgeois. The English-speaking refugees began to write their own psalm settings for use with the Bourgeois music. This famous version of Psalm 100 appeared in *Foursocre and Seven Psalms of David - Geneva, 1561*). William Kethe, claimed that he wrote the text, however this is not universally accepted.

This hymn tune, which is used universally in Christian churches, is known as the Doxology: *Praise God, from whom all blessings flow; Praise Him, all creatures here below; Praise Him above, you heavenly hosts; Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Amen!* In a protestant worship service, it is generally used as the gifts (offering, wine & bread, etc) are brought forward to the Pastor.

One could not reflect on the Church without meditating on the Mother of God, who is "intimately united with the Church. As Saint Ambrose taught, the Mother of



God is a type of the church in the order of faith, charity and perfect union with Christ" (Lumen Gentium). The council continues: "But while in the most holy Virgin, the Church has already reached that perfection whereby she is without spot or wrinkle, the followers of Church still strive to increase in holiness by conquering sin. And so they to their eyes to Mary who shines forth to the whole community of the elect as the model of virtues."

The Church honors the Virgin Mary especially in the Advent Liturgy and in Christmastide. Her major feasts are distributed throughout the rest of the Liturgical year. In this way the great things done for Mary by the Almighty are celebrated in the cycle of the year that commemorates the mysteries of Christ. The Mother of God helps us love the Church, the Mystical Body of her Son; to appreciate the honor of being members of this Body; to carry one another's burdens; and to do our part for the spread of the Gospel. The Blessed Virgin Mary knew how to direct toward God the movements of her heart. She knew how to pray. When Elizabeth praised Mary, the Virgin gave praise to God in the Magnificat, a magnificent elevation of the heart...

Pope John Paul II wrote that "Mary is a woman of the Eucharist in her whole life. The Church which looks to Mary as a model, is also called to imitate her in relationship in this holy Mystery." Let us pray to the Most Blessed Virgin Mary to intercede for us for a greater openness to the grace of God in our personal prayer; for more faith and devotion in the various liturgical celebrations, especially Holy Mass. Pope Benedict XVI

wrote on the same point: "Every time we approach the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharistic Liturgy, we also turn to her who, by her complete fidelity, received Christ's sacrifice for the whole Church"...The Mother of Christ, King of kings, and Lord of lords, will not forget her children who are striving to see clearly how better to witness to Jesus in society today...The Virgin Mary will help the Church to be, and continue to be, and authentic and credible voice of Jesus in the world today. Behold your mother, Jesus said to John at that supreme moment from the cross. Like the beloved disciple, let us take this exceptional Mother into our home.

Saint John Cemetery Saint Peter Cemetery

Two years ago Saint John Cemetery and Saint Peter Cemetery installed a Columbarium in each cemetery. A columbarium is a structure of vaults (or niches) lined with recesses for an urn of cremated remains. With the increase of cremation throughout the country, this could be an option for you to consider for your final resting place. Pricing begins at \$2,000.00 up to \$3,000.00. This includes opening/closing the niche at the time of death, the engraving on the marble plate which covers each niche. There are 96 niches at Saint John Cemetery and 35 niches at Saint Peter Cemetery. Pictures of each columbarium can be found below. If you are interested, please call the Parish Office.


