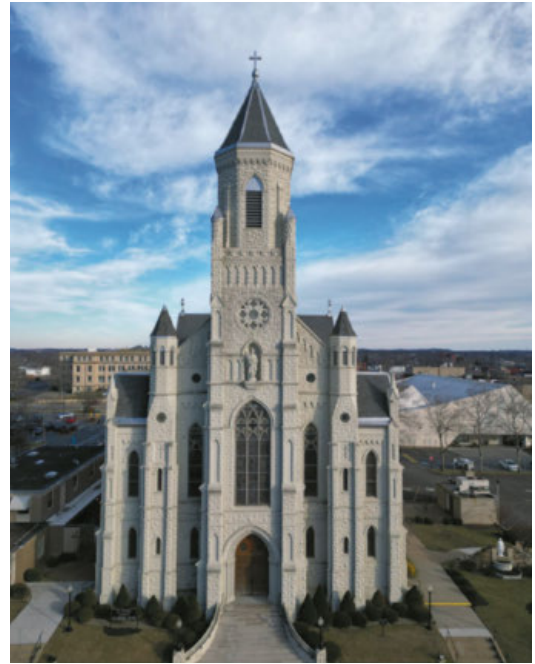

The text for this hymn is the from the *Canticle of the Sun* written by Francis of Assisi during an illness in 1225. It was one of the earliest poetic works in Italian. The Italian text praises God for his creation. Over the years, minor changes have been made for archaic and exclusive language.

The tune, *Lasst uns erfreuen* appeared in *Geistliches Kirchengesane* (Cologne, 1623). The original version had a single alleluia at the end of each phrase and three additional alleluias at the end. Ralph Vaughan Williams gave the tune its modern form and introduced it to the English speaking world in the *English Hymnal* (London, 1906).

A Reading from the Book of Exodus:


The whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. 

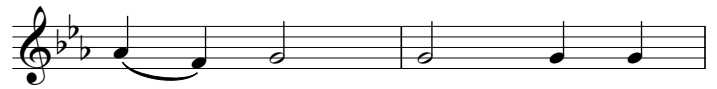

Dear Friends:

This weekend, please welcome Fr. Richard Pentello, who will be celebrating the Sunday morning Masses for me only. Fr. Pentello is a Canton native, recently retired from St. Patrick Church in Kent. Welcome Fr. Pentello.

When I was a newly ordained priest, I noticed my pastor had some interesting information on Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati. Like Blessed Carlos Acutis, Blessed Frassati's popularity has grown over the years. I would like to share with you some information about him. He is also very popular with young adults.

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati was born on April 6, 1901, to a prominent and wealthy Italian family, became a role model soon after he died on July 4, 1925, at the age of 24. Like Blessed Carlo, he could be declared a saint during the Catholic Church's 2025 Jubilee Year, according to the head of the Vatican's office for saints' causes.

According to the website dedicated to him by the U.S. Catholic Bishops, for years Frassati has been "a significant global patron for youth and young adults--and has a special place in the hearts of people across the United States as well. St. John Paul II declared him a patron for World Youth Days and deemed him 'the man of the beatitudes; as he exemplified those blessings in his everyday life.

Here are 12 amazing facts about his short but very intense life.

1. Despite being raised by agnostic parents, Frassati's inclinations to help others manifested in his childhood. Once as a child, he answered the door to find a mother begging with her son who was shoeless. He took off his own shoes and gave them to the child.

2. At an early age, he joined the Marian Sodality and the Apostleship of Prayer and obtained permission to receive daily Communion, which was rare in that time.

3. At the same time, he was known among his friends as "Il Terrore" (The Terror) due to his fondness for practical jokes.

4. At 17, he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society and dedicated much of his spare time in taking care of the poor, the homeless, the sick, and the demobilized servicemen returning from World War I.

5. In 1919 Frassati joined the Catholic Student Foundation and Popular Party, whose principles were based in the social doctrine of the Church. He strongly opposed the rise of the fascist leader Benito Mussolini and was jailed in Rome after joining the protest of the Catholic Worker's Association.

6. He became notable for giving literally everything he had to the poor. He would even use his bus fare for charity and then run home to be on time for meals.

7. An avid and accomplished mountain-climber, he saw many parallels between Catholic life and his favorite pastime. He would regularly organize trips into the mountains with occasions for prayers and conversation about faith on the way up and down from the summit.

8. After what would become his final climb he wrote a simple note on a photograph: "Verso L'Alto" (To the heights)--a phrase that has become a popular Catholic motto.

9. At 24, Frassati became very ill with polio. Some of his friends believed he contracted the disease from the people in the slums of Turin. In his last days, he whispered the names of people who still needed assistance to his family and friends who gathered at his bedside. He died on July 4, 1925.

10. Pier Giorgio Frassati was declared "Blessed" in 1990 by Pope John Paul II, who called him a "man of the beatitudes" and a "joyful apostle of Christ." A year before visiting his tomb, John Paul II revealed that he also had felt in his own youth "the beneficial influence of his example."

11. In her biography of her brother, Frassati's sister, Luciana, wrote that "he represented the finest in Christian youth: pure, happy, enthusiastic about everything good and beautiful."

12. Pier Giorgio Frassati's popularity is big among young people, especially in America. Many apostolates have been created in his name, and he is regarded as the patron of students (mainly because he wasn't very good in school), youth Catholics, mountaineers, youth groups, Catholic Action, Dominican tertiaries (he became one) and World Youth Day.

Saint John Cemetery Saint Peter Cemetery

Two years ago Saint John Cemetery and Saint Peter Cemetery installed a Columbarium in each cemetery. A columbarium is a structure of vaults (or niches) lined with recesses for an urn of cremated remains. With the increase of cremation throughout the country, this could be an option for you to consider for your final resting place. Pricing begins at \$2,000.00 up to \$3,000.00. This includes opening/closing the niche at the time of death, the engraving on the marble plate which covers each niche. There are 96 niches at Saint John Cemetery and 35 niches at Saint Peter Cemetery. Pictures of each columbarium can be found below. If you are interested, please call the Parish Office.



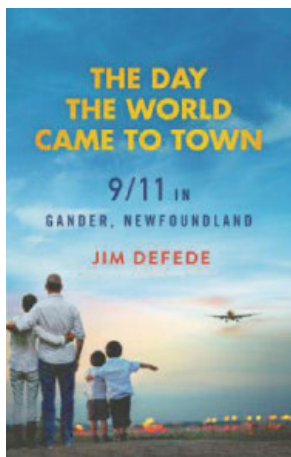


