
To Jesus Christ, Our Soverign King Ich Glaub an Gott

This hymn text appeared in the author's (Martin B. Hellriegel) *Collection of Hymns Compiled and Edited for Use at Holy Cross Parish (St. Louis, 1963)*. Hellriegel included it in the section for the feast of Christ the King. The text is unusual in that second and fourth lines of each stanza all rhyme with each other. The feminine cadences of the hymn tune may have suggested this.

The tune, *Ich Glaub an Gott*, takes its name from the hymn with which it was printed in the Mainz Gesangbuch (1870). It is popular in this country because of its aassociation with Hellriegel's hymn text. Richard Proulx, a prolific composer in the Roman Catholic Church for many, many, years added the harmonization that we use today.

Dear Friends:

Find True Peace

As Catholics we understand that the key to true happiness and peace lies in proclaiming Christ as our Lord and following Him faithfully. By knowing Jesus, experiencing His Love, keeping His commandments, and serving Him in others, we will find genu-



ine joy, fulfillment, and peace.

Know Jesus and experience His love:

God invites each of us to enter into a deep friendship with Him (John 15:15). This friendship is characterized by mutual respect, intimacy, and cooperation. Jesus reveals His love for us through the Scriptures, the Sacraments of the Church, and especially through the Mass. In prayer, ask God to reveal His personal, everlasting love for you. That's a prayer He is eager to answer.

Love Him back:

Do you know some who claims to care but ignores what you say? Jesus our greatest Friend, asks us to listen to Him. "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." (John 14:15). By living the Ten Commandments and the Eight Beatitudes, we demonstrate our love for Jesus.

Service Him in our neighbors:

For Mother (Saint) Teresa, serving the poor was synonymous with serving Jesus (Matthew 25:40). She prepared their beds and treated their wounds as if He were the next to use them. By performing ordinary tasks with love and intentionality, we can experience true and lasting happiness.

Why are there Church precepts?

Just as families have household rules guiding how each member contributes to supporting the home, the Catholic Church has issued rules, called precepts, that act as principal obligations of every Catholic. There are: attend Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation, receive Communion and attend confession at least once annually, study Catholic teaching. observe the Church's marriage laws, give children religious training, to strengthen and support the parish community, do penance, and join the Catholic mission.






Young Adult Group (Ages 18-39)









