
Alexander Reinagle published this tune in his *Psalms Tunes for Voice and Piano* (Oxford 1830). It is named for the church at which he was organist.





# A Missionary Priest for a Missionary Time

Many of you know that I enjoy history. For many years I've enjoyed reading about the missionary journeys of priests and religious throughout our country. I've belonged to the Bishop Baraga Association for many years. Bishop Baraga was



a Slovenian missionary who was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, and later served as a missionary bishop way up in Michigan, dying in 1868 as the Bishop of Marquette. His cause for beatification is now up. It has been for many years, but we need a miracle to advance his case.

Monsignor Joseph Buh was a priest from the Diocese of Duluth, and like Bishop Baraga was a Slovenian missionary who came to the United States. He served as a missionary in Minnesota for over 50 years. He died over 100 years ago in 1922, but Bishop John McNicholas, the Bishop of Duluth at that time said that Msgr. Buh's "zeal for souls was ever a burning fire" and that the "whole Church of America is indebted" to him. Bishop McNicholas later became Archbishop of Cincinnati, where Bishop Baraga was ordained, and also one of our pastors, Bishop John Henni was ordained and later because the first Bishop of Milwaukee.

Born in Slovenia in 1833, Buh was a priest and missionary in Minnesota in its earliest days as a state. Ordained a priest in 1858--the same year Minnesota was named a state. Buh was integral to the development of the Church in the region. While ministering to the poor immigrants and to the Native American populations, he helped establish over 50 parishes within the Diocese of Duluth. Buh was greatly loved because of his devotion to serving the Church and the spiritual needs of the faithful.

"The Casual observer would not even direct his attention to the extraordinary zeal of this gentle apostle." It is only when one realized the great harvest he has reaped that one is forced to take into account the many deep furrows that he plowed in the harvest fields of Christ." Bishop McNicholas stated at his funeral.

"No journey on foot, no distance by horseback was too long

or too trying provided a soul was to be helped at the journey's end. He would set out with a trust in God realizing that God's love of souls was infinite and that he was but the dispenser of the riches of God's sacramental graces. He was ever willing to make every sacrifice in the performance of duty for the salvation of souls." McNicholas continued in his homily.

On July 25th, Buh's remains were exhumed and transferred to Duluth's Cathedral of Our Lady of the Rosary. Why do I write about him to you? We have several Slovenian people in our parish, but I have also forwarded booklets to the Slovenian priests in Cleveland. My longtime friend, Fr. John Kumse, Pastor of St. Mary's Slovenian Church in the Collinwood section of Cleveland is very much a lover of Slovenian culture and history. I would hope he would eventually share the booklet I have and holy cards with his parishioners. Cleveland still has a very large Slovenian population.

Bishop Felton, the new Bishop of Duluth has written we are living in a missionary time. Our real call to mission is grounded in the growing numbers of people who do not know, care, or believe in the person of Jesus, much less as our Lord and Savior.

Fewer and fewer people make any connection between the Church and the Body of Christ Himself. Even though this is a unique circumstance and challenge



in our own given day and age, Msgr. Buh is a great reminder that this isn't the first time that we have been living in a missionary time. Thus, we can have an incredible opportunity to learn from and be inspired by a missionary priest who was profoundly calling people to know, care, and believe in the person of Jesus. 




