



A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to John: *Glory to you, O Lord.*

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you."



Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine,

without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew — the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.


Nicene Creed



February 1st & 2nd is the **Feast the the Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple**. It is also a day when candles are blessed. In keeping with this beautiful tradition. I will have tables set up in both churches for candles to be blessed.

I will bless candles that will grace our altars this year, our votive candles. **And I invite you to bring candles for your homes to be blessed!!!** I will do candle blessings at all the Masses. This is a beautiful ritual and tradition. Please bring your own candles to be a part of this wonderful blessing.

Also, on the weekend of February 1st & 2nd we are delighted to invite you to see and purchase handmade religious articles made by the Sisters of St. Elizabeth Convent in Belarus. They will have tables in back of the churches after the Masses.

The Sisterhood of St. Elizabeth was founded in 1996. Their missionary began in a national mental hospital located not far from their convent. The Sisters take care of mentally challenged children and adults. Life of the child with diagoneses such as Down syndrome, birth traumas or congenital physical defects may be quite short and it is painful to see them suffering. Also the adult patients need constant support owing to the fact that their illnesses make it impossible for them to adapt socially.

In the recent years a shelter and house of Labor for fomer drug and alcohol addicted people was organized some 20 miles away from the convent. A lot of homeless, struggling and lost people get a change for a new start in life and also find God.

In order to help these people some workshops were organized on the premises of the Convent where vulnerable people have a possibility to express themselves in art for God working together with nuns and making icons (including hand painted), crosses, crucifixes, wood carvings, embroidered and ceramic gifts, rosaries, and vestments. All these goods made with love and prayer brings blessings to their owners.

Please offer your support to these wonderful Sisters, and those who work in their community.


