Merry "Little" Christmas!

The Feast of the Epiphany we celebrate this weekend has also been called Little Christmas. Christ is made manifest to us in this Feast. Water is traditionally blessed on this day, and we can renew our baptismal promises. As we did last year, I've requested that we leave our Christmas decorations up a little longer so everyone can enjoy them. January can be dark and depressing anyway, and it is nice to come to the churches and see them with the decorations still up. Traditionally the season of Christmas actually ends on February 2nds, the Feast of the Presentation.

I would like to thank everyone who had a hand in making our Christmas season beautiful, from our musicians, and decorators, and those who work behind the scenes to make everything move smoothly. I would also like to thank everyone for their Christmas cards and gifts, and food. It makes me feel appreciated. Lastly, I would like to thank Fr. Joseph Tuscan, a Capuchin Franciscan, whose home is in Canton. He was home visiting his dad over the Christmas holiday, and he took a few Masses for me. Thanks Fr. Joseph!

With the beginning of the New Year, I also want to thank all of you for our generosity to the parish. You really came through, especially with the food pantry. One of the important missions of our parish is feeding the poor, and our outreach to them. This is manifested in our food pantry. I would like to share with you a little information about the outreach of the pantry.

Every week we have about 60 to 70 people who come to our door to receive a bag of food. The bag usually contains two cans of soup, one can of fruit, vegetable, baked beans, a meat dish, tuna, a jar of peanut butter, mac and cheese, a pack of ramen noodles, 4 packs of instant oatmeal, a sleeve of saltine crackers, graham crackers, and a roll of toilet paper. Because of parishioners donations, we also, the vast majority of the

time, are able to add an extra item in each bag like a box of noodles, pudding, etc.

Through the generosity of a local family foundation, we have also been providing each person who comes with additional household items such as laundry detergent, dish soap, and other toiletry items such as bar soap, toothpaste and deodorant.

The cost for an average bag of food is \$14.60. We are spending on average \$4,100 a month to supply the pantry, so we appreciate your continued generosity. As it states in Hebrews 13:16 "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for such sacrifices, God is pleased." This is just a little information for all of you in what the food pantry does in its monthly outreach.

I wish you a happy and blessed New Year, and thank you for your kindness in giving to your parish and ministries.

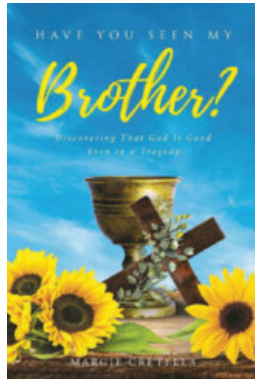
## Homebound Ministry

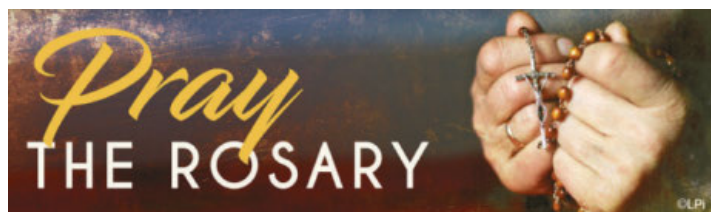

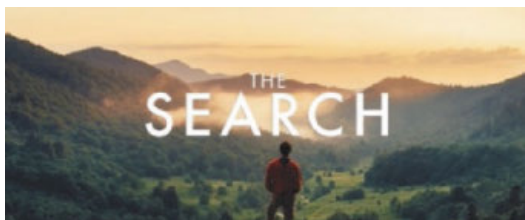
