





# A Reading from the Book of Nehemiah:

Ezra the priest brought the law before the assembly, which consisted of men, women, and those children old enough to understand. Standing at one end of the open place that was before the Water Gate, he read out of the book from daybreak till midday, in the presence of the men, the women, and those children old enough to understand; and all the people listened attentively to the book of the law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion. He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it — for he was standing higher up than any of the people—; and, as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, "Amen, amen!" Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground. Ezra read plainly from the book of the law of God, interpreting it so that all could understand what was read. Then Nehemiah, that is, His Excellency, and Ezra the priest-scribe and the Levites who were instructing the people said to all the people: "Today is holy to the LORD your God. Do not be sad, and do not weep"— for all the people were weeping as they heard the words of the law. He said further: "Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared; for today is holy to our LORD. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the LORD must be your strength!"

SECOND READING

I Corinthians 12:12-30

# A reading from the first Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians:

Brothers and sisters: As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit. Now the body is not a single part, but many. If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. Or if an ear should say, "Because I am not an eye I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the

hand," I do not need you," nor again the head to the feet, "I do not need you." Indeed, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary, and those parts of the body that we consider less honorable we surround with greater honor, and our less presentable parts are treated with greater propriety, whereas our more presentable parts do not need this. But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy. Now you are Christ's body, and individually parts of it. Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues. Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work mighty deeds? Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues? Do all interpret?

# A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke: Glory to you, O Lord.

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received. Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news

of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

# Household of God - by Father Misbrener

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Early Saturday morning, on January 11th, I lost my long-time companion and good canine friend, Clyde. He died in my arms with me petting him. I'm happy that I didn't have to take him to the vet to have him put down. Clyde was with me for over 10 years, so he was with me when I was in Rootstown. If you are a dog-lover, and pet



owner in general, you know what I mean when I write about losing a dog. They really become a part of your life. It is always hard to say goodbye.

Bishop Warren Boudreaux was the founding bishop of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, Louisiana in 1977. He grew up in Cajun country, and one of the treasured books I have was written by him shortly before he died. It is an autobiography that he signed for me. He died in 1997, shortly after I was ordained a priest, so his "Diary of a Cajun Bishop" is a nice collectors item. Bishop Boudreaux was ordained a priest in 1942, and he was a Father of the Second Vatican Council, so having his musings about what happened at the council are a real treasure trove of what REALLY happened at the council.

The bishop writes about his priesthood, becoming a bishop as a young man, the wonderful people he worked with, his family, and also his pets, and he wrote extensively on the many dogs he had over the years. I reread his book over and over again. It is just one enjoyable story to read, of a bygone era, not only in our Church, but in our country as well. He wrote how much joy dogs gave him throughout his life, and how he sometimes liked dogs more than people. These days, that would be easy to write about! Sometimes I love dogs more than people on most days, but it depends on what kind of day I'm having.

While I mourned for Clyde (I am only writing this now, because I couldn't bring myself to talk about it last week.) The spacious rectory was just too quiet, so I went to get another dog, or, can I also say, the dog found me! My new dog's name is Carlos, and he is the same breed as Clyde was, a Mountain Cur mix. I've had to take a couple of steps of retraining him to be housebroken once again, but it has been working alright. Carlos was in the shelter for nearly two years, so it was wonderful to spring him!

He's about five years old, so he isn't fully a puppy, but he has some of those puppy qualities.

I have Clyde's remains with me. He was cremated here by a nice company in Canton. He's with my other dogs on a nice shelf in my living room.

Many years ago, when I lost another dog, my sister Lisa gave me a plaque with a beautiful quote on it. It is anonymous, but I'd like to share it with you anyway.

"it came to me that every time I lose a dog they take a piece of my heart with them, and every new dog who comes into my life gifts me with a piece of their heart. If you live long enough all the components of my heart will be dog, and I will become as generous and loving as they are."

We can only hope so!!! Please remember to bring your candles for blessing on the weekend of February 1st & 2nd. I will be blessing candles during ALL MASSES for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. You can bring candles to take back home and keep blessed candles in your home.

# Saint John Cemetery Saint Peter Cemetery

Two years ago Saint John Cemetery and Saint Peter Cemetery installed a Columbarium in each cemetery. A columbarium is a structure of vaults (or niches) lined with recesses for an urn of cremated remains. With the increase of cremation throughout the country, this could be an option for you to consider for your final resting place. Pricing begins at \$2,000.00 up to \$3,000.00. This includes opening/closing the niche at the time of death, the engraving on the marble plate which covers each niche. There are 96 niches at Saint John Cemetery and 35 niches at Saint Peter Cemetery. Pictures of each columbarium can be found below. If you are interested, please call the Parish Office.
